Ofqual Title: STA Level 2 Award in Aquatic Teaching - People with Disabilities (QCF)

Aim

Holders of the **People with Disabilities** qualification can teach aquatic activities to individuals and groups with disabilities.

Pre-requisites

- 18 years of age or older
- Current membership of STA
- Hold the Pool Emergency Procedures qualification or acceptable equivalent
- Hold either the Safeguarding Children, Young People and Vulnerable Adults certificate (available online at www.trainsta.co.uk) or acceptable equivalent

Validity of Award

The qualification does not have an expiry date.

To remain as an STA approved swimming teacher, and to receive the benefit of STA public liability insurance, holders of the qualification are required to:

- 1. Remain in membership of the STA
- 2. Keep knowledge up to date with regular CPDs
- 3. Keep their prerequisite lifesaving qualification in date
- 4. Regularly update their CRB.

Length of Course

48 Notional Learning Hours comprising:

- 24 contact Guided Learning Hours
- 24 non contact Guided Learning Hours

Course Information

Units studied include:

- Planning, preparing and teaching People with Disabilities swimming
- People with Disabilities

Assessment

Candidates must complete a portfolio and worksheet questions to the satisfaction of the course tutor as well as undertaking at least 30 minutes poolside teaching during the course.

There will also be an external assessment where candidate must:

- Teach a 15 minute lesson to a class of 4 learners
- Complete a 30 question multiple choice question paper with a unit pass mark of 11 out of 15 per unit

Revalidation

This qualification does not require revalidation. However, STA recommends all members attend or complete CPDs to continuously update their knowledge and skills.
