WHAT IMPACT IS THE COST-OF-LIVING CRISIS HAVING ON CHILDREN'S SWIMMING LESSONS?



Alongside STA's Swim School Survey (October 2022) which identified that applying zero-rated VAT on the teaching of all learn to swim and water lifesaving skills lessons in the UK would help thousands of swim schools across the UK stay afloat in this economic crisis - STA surveyed* 1,046 parents with children aged 16 and under, to ascertain their viewpoint and what the impact the cost-of-living crisis is having on their children's swimming lessons.

LEARNING TO SWIM

4 IN 10 (40%) parents say their child does NOT currently know how to swim and 23% of parents with a child aged 11 admitting the same.


