Swim to the Beat This February & Raise Funds for the BHF

Tomorrow marks the first day of Heart Month, and the start of our Swim to the Beat fundraiser with the British Heart Foundation (BHF). So far, we

have more than 20,000 swimmers from all over the UK (and internationally) who have pledged to take part in our inaugural 'swim to the beat' campaign, which will help the BHF fund vital scientific research that can save and improve the lives of people affected by heart and circulatory diseases.

It Was Time to STAnd Up For Swimming in 2022 – And We All Did!

With the last STAnd Up for Swimming course now complete, we can confirm the headline results from this yearlong initiative which we launched in January 2022 to help train new swimming teachers around the UK for free using our own charity funds:

- 1. More than 900 new swimming teachers received free training across England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
- 2. 75% have found employment, with the rest actively seeking employment.
- 3. A half have been employed by the swim school that originally nominated them, or by the facility where they received the training.
- 4. 70% were NEW to the leisure industry.
- 5. A FIFTH hadn't thought about a career in swimming teaching until they saw the STAnd Up for Swimming campaign.

STAnd Up for Swimming has also helped employers save at least **£303,800** on training costs alone this year (in addition to savings on recruitment, organisational and administration costs).

Well done to everyone involved for making this our biggest and most successful charity campaign to date – from our tutors, assessors, volunteers and those that helped find venues, to the learners and everyone who nominated and donated. Special thanks also to our fantastic sponsors.



Keep #STAmpOutVAT in the Spotlight

This month, we have also been continuing to keep our **#STAmpOutVAT** campaign in the media spotlight and speaking to MPs to voice our shared concerns about the rising pool costs and the impact this is having on swim schools – and why removing VAT from swimming lessons taught by privately-run swim schools is a positive solution, and would not only put them on a fair level playing field with lesson providers in the public sector but would also help secure the future of many swim schools businesses in the current climate, and ensure parents can continue to afford swimming lessons.

Dave Candler, STA's CEO, says: "The response from the government so far to **#STAmpOutVAT** clearly shows, frustratingly, a lack of understanding of the complexities of the learn to swim market and the important service private swim schools deliver to teach children a key life skill. While we plan our next steps, we would urge swim schools to keep writing to their local MPs and encourage their parents to as well using the letter template on our website."
